President's Message

Dear Members,

The first quarter of the year has rather passed very quickly and hope all of you are doing well. I am more actively involved with MBBS and MD teaching rather than my research now a days.

In this newsletter I want to focus on the changes that I think we need in Microbiology teaching at both undergraduate and post graduate level. Medical Microbiology has advanced by leaps and bounds in last



30 years since I joined this speciality. The innovations and technologies have brought us in the forefront of providing diagnosis and management of infectious diseases, hospital infection control and rationale use of antibiotics. We need to keep up with this pace in our teaching of MBBS and MD students as well. Many MD residents are now interested in Microbiology as it is one of the most advancing branches of medical sciences.

For MBBS curriculum, I suggest that we work with MCI in changing the curriculum and adopt an approach of teaching infectious diseases; their etiologies and laboratory diagnosis rather than teaching individual organisms. MBBS students need to know which clinical disease syndromes are caused by various infectious agents, how we diagnose them and prevent them. They should also be familiar with advanced methods in diagnosis of microbial diseases. Similar curriculum has been already adapted at AIIMS successfully.

For post graduate teaching, new concept and advances should be adopted in the curriculum, and the focus should be on clinical Microbiology, rather than laying emphasis on bench Microbiology. India is becoming the hub of medical tourism so post graduates need to have knowledge on quality control, and hospital infection control policies. These aspects are completely lacking in current post graduate curriculum. The post graduates need to understand rationale use of antibiotics and antibiotic policy to prevent the menace of antimicrobial resistance. Many Microbiology departments are equipped with automations and molecular techniques and therefore the emphasis should be given to practical hands on training in these technologies. Traditional Microbial techniques though not forgotten can take a back seat in today's world. I understand that IAMM has already submitted a revised curriculum to MCI which is awaiting approval. I shall appreciate if we all put our minds together and think about these suggestions in our undergraduate and postgraduate teaching.

Looking forward to meet you all in Ranchi.



infrastructure for surveillance of infectious diseases to ensure health safety by networking of laboratories within Assam. In this regard, a software will be developed for compilation of data within Assam.

- 4. Removal of Microbiology paper from DCP course: All the members have agreed that the newly formed association will try to remove the Microbiology paper from DCP course under the from Srimanta Sankaradeva university of Health Sciences, Assam. In this regard necessary communication may also be sent to MCI.
- 5. Appointment of MD Microbiologists in the Laboratories of Private Health Care Setting: Will coordinate with the relevant authorities to ensure appointment of at least one Medical Microbiologist having MD Microbiology degree in all laboratories responsible for giving microbiology report.
- 6. Appointment of MD Microbiologist in any hospital having Intensive Care Unit facility: Will coordinate with relevant authority to ensure appointment of a MD Microbiologist in all the Govt. and private hospitals having ICU facility who will act as Infectious Disease Specialist for all purpose e.g. surveillance of Hospital Acquired Infection and its prevention and control, judicial use of antibiotics to prevent emergence of Multi Drug Resistant bacteria to reduce morbidity and mortality.

The XIII Annual Conference of UP-UK Chapter of IAMM, UP-UK MICROCON-2017 was organized by Dr. R.K. Invited Guest Lectures included 'Optimizing Microbiology from Collection to Care' by Dr. Suhas Nirkhiwale from Kailash Hospital, Indore; 'Role of Rapid Molecular Diagnosis in Antibiotic Stewardship' by Dr. Naveen Kumar of Medanta Hospital and '16s rRNA methyltranferases NDM variants and Colistin Resistances' by Dr. K.N. Prasad of SGPGI, Lucknow.

The rich scientific programme also included P.C. Sen Junior Scientist Best Paper Award and Archana Ayyagari Junior Scientist Best Paper on Antimicrobial Resistance Award Sessions. IAMM-EQAS South Centre

Please find below a brief write up on the IAMM-EQAS from November 2016 to May 2017.

The IAMM-EQAS program was formally handed over to the Christian Medical College, Vellore in October 2016. The last package for the year 2016, the 94th EQAS package, was sent out by CMC, Vellore.

The 94th EQAS package sent out in November 2016 followed the existing pattern of a bacteriology smear for interpretation, a lyophilized culture for identification and susceptibility testing and sera for Virology testing.

Smear sent: Many pus cells many gram positive cocci arranged in clusters, pairs and short chains. Few disintegrated forms seen.

Suggestive of Staphylococcus species

Culture sent: Carbapenemase producing Klebsiella pneumoniae subspp pneumoniae


We had an existing 611 enrolled participants.

No of participants who responded: 531/611=87%

• Percentage of correct smear reports among participants: 424/529 x100 =80 %

• Percentage of correct culture reports among participants: 466/524 x100 = 88.9%

• Percentage of correct AST among participants: 371/524 x100 = 70.8%



Following ratification at the 2016 MICROCON -IAMM governing body meeting held at Chandigarh in November 2016, the final decisions for 2017 were drawn.

The new EQAS format included of a multi-tiered EQAS enrollment opportunity with the aim to validate the competency of the participating centers in India and abroad in the hope of ensuring standardized Microbiology diagnostic capability.

Tier 1: Common Bacteriology ad Virology EQAS consists of 3 packages/year with a total of 12 challenges/package.

Tier 2: Advanced Bacteriology EQAS

OPTION 1: Molecular panel for identification consists of 3 challenges twice yearly.

OPTION 2: Molecular panel for detection of antimicrobial resistance consists of 3 challenges twice yearly.

OPTION 3: Specimen identification panel consists of 4 packages yearly with 3 specimens/package.

Tier 2: Advanced Virology EQAS

OPTION 1: Serology scheme

OPTION 2: Molecular scheme

A total of 575 participants were enrolled for 2017 and the Tier 1 EQAS commenced in March 2017 as the 95th IAMM-EQAS. We have received a 99% response form the participants of the 95th IAMM-EQAS.

Our registrations will remain open until June 2017.

Participation certificates will be awarded to laboratories that have participated in 2 of the 3 cycles during the year 2017.

We are grateful to the IAMM governing body for the opportunity and honour in allowing us to serve as the IAMM-EQAS providers for the south zone.

Hospital Outbreak Genomics study from India: PM dream coming true Dr. Vikas Gautam

Outbreaks of bacterial infections are serious concerns in hospital setting and particularly in ICU wards. Burkholderia cepacia complex has been recognized as the most common contaminant of pharmaceutical products as per 8 years FDA report analysis. We got these bacterial isolates from blood samples of children admitted in neonatal intensive care unit during outbreak and from surface cap of amikacin vial during surveillance in a Mumbai hospital. While the research team from Topiwala National Medical College and BYL Nair Charitable Hospital, Mumbai that included Drs Swapna Mali, Lona Dash and Jayant Shastri, carried out clinical investigation and surveillance, the research team led by Dr Vikas Gautam from PGI carried out initial molecular typing to prove the identity of the outbreak isolates as Burkholderia cenocepacia. The research team led by Dr. Prabhu Patil at CSIR-IMTECH carried out whole genome sequencing and analysis of the hospital isolates at IMTECH. It was discovered that genome sequence of isolates from blood and surface cap of amikacin vial differed by few nucleotides indicating that all of them are clones. The study published in Frontiers in Microbiology realizes one the dream of PM Modi of make in India by carrying out genome based study of a hospital borne infection completely from the country.
