REPORT OF MICROCON 2023 22nd-26thNovember 2023

MICROCON - 2023

46th ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF INDIAN ASSOCIATION OF MEDICAL MICROBIOLOGISTS King George Medical University, Lucknow, UP

"Every Microbe Matters - A Triumph of Knowledge and Collaboration"

The 46th Annual Conference of the Indian Association of Medical Microbiologists (IAMM), MICROCON 2023, held from November 23rd to 26th at the Atal Bihari Vajpayee Scientific Convention Center, Lucknow, orchestrated by the Department of Microbiology, King George's Medical University (KGMU), Lucknow, was an extraordinary confluence of knowledge, innovation, and collaboration. The theme "Every Microbe Matters" resonated throughout the event, setting the stage for an enriching and impactful experience.

Diving deep into the realms of medical microbiology, MICROCON 2023 commenced with a series of 14 Pre-conference Workshops and Continuing Medical Education (CME) sessions held at KGMU, Lucknow, 2 at RMLIMS, one each at SGPGIMS and Medanta Hospital on November 22nd and 23rd, drawing participation from 400 enthusiastic attendees.

The inauguration ceremony on November 23rd at Atal Bihari Vajpayee Scientific Convention Center, KGMU was presided by DR Arti Kapil, President iAMM. It witnessed the esteemed presence of Shri Mayankeshwar Sharan Singh, State Minister of Parliamentary Affairs, Medical Education, Medical and Health, Family Welfare, and Mother and Child Welfare, Government of U.P., as the Chief Guest. The unveiling of the MICROCON 2023 Souvenir and Abstract Book marked a moment of pride and celebration, encapsulating the essence of the conference. Dr. Sonal Saxena, Secretary of IAMM, delivered the Annual Report, providing insights into the achievements and milestones of the association. A moment of recognition unfolded as IAMM bestowed awards upon deserving individuals, acknowledging their exceptional contributions to the field of medical microbiology. IAMM Presidential Oration Award 2023 to Dr Arti Kapil, Dr. U. C. Chaturvedi, Lifetime Achievement Award 2023 to Dr. Nancy Malla, Dr. H.I. Jhala Memorial Award 2023 to Dr B. L. Sherwal, Dr S C Aggarwal Oration Memorial Award 2023 to Dr. Pragya D. Yadav, IAMM Endowment Lecture Award 2023 to Dr. Ranganathan N Iyer.

On Day 1, November 24th of MICROCON 2023 showcased diverse sessions, including the Dr. K.B. Sharma Memorial Junior Best Paper Presentations, the President's Oration and IAMM Endowment Oration. The Student Symposium explored "Outbreak Investigation of Emerging Zoonotic Diseases," engaging participants in thought-provoking discussions. The conference featured parallel scientific sessions, covering crucial topics such as Superbugs and Antibacterial Agents, Antimicrobial Resistance, Fungal Diagnostics, Parasitic Infections, Diagnostic Virology, Innovations in Hepatitis Management, TB Management, Clinical Microbiology, Syndromic Testing, New Technologies in Diagnostics, and more.

Day 2 included the IAMM Quiz, a symposium on "Clinical Microbiology at Crossroads: Genomics to Precision Medicine," and sessions on Blood Culture and Sepsis, Next-Generation Approaches to Tackle AMR, Zoonotic Diseases, Anaerobes,

Medical Education, Laboratory Accreditation, New Vaccines, Mycobacteria, and Sepsis Diagnosis. The evening was adorned with a cultural banquet, "Jashn@Awadh," celebrating the rich heritage of the region.

The final day unveiled a plenary session on "Tackling AMR through Enhancing Infection Prevention and Control Practices." Parallel sessions explored topics ranging from Infectious Viral Diseases, HIV and STIs, Next-Generation Sequencing, Fungal Infections, Cutting Edge Technologies in Infectious Disease Control, Advances in Parasitology, to the critical tenets of Antimicrobial Stewardship.

MICROCON 2023 witnessed a vibrant exchange of ideas, with over 160 oral papers and 600 posters presented by delegates. The conference drew a massive turnout of 1500 delegates, including 300+ Faculty members, supported by 150 dedicated volunteers. The bustling exhibition halls hosted 60+ exhibitors showcasing cutting-edge products.

MICROCON 2023 was a celebration of the intricate world of Clinical Microbiology. The rich exchange of ideas, the collaborative spirit, and the innovative solutions presented have undoubtedly left an indelible mark on the landscape of medical science.

Salient points in PGMER 2023 Gazette Notified by National Medical Commission New Delhi, dated 29th December, 2023

- Eligibility to pursue a post-graduate broad-speciality course in Medicine shall be as per "NMC, National Exit Test Regulations, 2023". However, NEET-PG will continue till National Exit Test (NExT) batch becomes eligible for admission.
- No student finally designated to a medical institution, notwithstanding anything stated in these Regulations, shall be permitted migration to any other medical institution.
- 3. MD Microbiology is now a feeder branch for DM(Infectious diseases) along with DM (virology).
- 4. Every institution undertaking post-graduate training programme shall set up an Academic Cell, under the Chairmanship of a senior faculty member, who shall monitor the implementation of training programmes in each speciality and ensure its quality as mandated by the PGMEB.
- 5. Post-graduate students of broad and super Speciality degree courses shall maintain adynamic e-log book which needs to be updated on a weekly basis. It shall be the duty of the Post-graduate guide imparting the training to assess and authenticate monthly the record (e-Log) books.
- The post-graduate students shall essentially be required to participate in the teaching and training programme of undergraduate students and interns.
- 7. During the training for award of Degree/Diploma, there shall be proper training in basic medical sciences related to the disciplines concerned..
- 8. A post-graduate student of a degree course in will do at least one of the following to make him/her eligible to appear in his/her final examination:

- a. Poster presentation at a National/Zonal/State conference of his/her speciality;
- b. Podium presentation at a National/Zonal/State conference of his/her speciality;
- Have one research paper published/accepted for publication in journal of his/her speciality as first author.
- All post-graduate students shall complete an online course in Research Methodology, course on ethics including Good Clinical Practices and Good Laboratory Practices and Basic Cardiac Life Support (BCLS) and Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) skills course in 1st year.
- 10. DRP as per guidelines laid down earlier
- 11. Minimum 20 days of paid leave (casual leave) per year with academic paid leave of 5 days per year.
- 12. Mandatory for the college to provide appropriate residential accommodation to post-graduate students. However, it will not be mandatory for the post-graduate students to stay in the hostel.
- 13. The Dean/Director/Principal of Medical College/Institution and Medical Superintendent of attached hospital can be only medico with post-graduate medical degree from a recognised/accredited institution with a minimum of ten years teaching experience as faculty.
- 14. Marks for theory (400 for 4 papers), Practical (300) and Viva voce (100) have been defined. 5% of mark of total marks of Clinical/Practical and Viva Voce marks (20 marks) will be of dissertation/thesis and it will be part of clinical/practical examination marks.
- 15. The candidate shall secure not less than 50% marks in each head of passing and no grace marks to be given.

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS OF IAMM AWARDS & PRIZES 2024 (Last date of receipt of all nominations July 31, 2024)

- 1. Dr SC Agarwal Oration 2025: This award is supported from the interest incurred from a fund donated by Dr SC Agarwal. It is to be given to a senior member of the association above 50 years for his /her outstanding contribution to the field of Medical Microbiology. Nominations for the award, duly proposed and seconded with consent of the nominee along as a soft copy of his/her biodata should reach the IAMM Secretary's office on or before 31st July 2024. The award carries a citation and a gold medal. The awardee is to deliver an oration at the National IAMM Conference to be held in 2025. Nominations must come as a soft/hard copy to be sent to Secretary IAMM by the last date.
- 2. Dr. H. I. Jhala Memorial award 2025: This award is given to a senior member of the association above the age of 50 years, who has made significant contribution to the development of Medical microbiology in India. This award is supported from the interest from the fixed deposit donated by the organizers of the IAMM congress held at Sholapur in 1983. Nominations for the award, duly proposed and seconded with the consent of the nominee along with consent of the nominee as a soft copy of his/her biodata should reach the IAMM Secretary's office on or before 31st July 2024. The award carries a citation and a gold medal. The award will be conferred at the National IAMM Conference to be held in 2025. Nominations must come as a soft copy to be sent to Secretary IAMM by the last date.
- 3. IAMM Endowment lecture award 2025: This award is supported by the annual interest obtained from the fixed deposit, donated by the organizers of the IAMM congress held at Hyderabad in 1985. This award is given to an eminent Medical Microbiologist, over the age of 50 years from India and abroad for their outstanding work in the field of Medical Microbiology, Bacteriology, Virology, Mycology, Parasitology/Immunology/ Epidemiology and Microbiological techniques. Nominations for the award, duly proposed and seconded with the consent of the nominee along with consent of the nominee as a soft copy of his/her biodata, including a write up on the contribution of the nominee to Medical Microbiology should reach the IAMM Secretary's office on or before 31st July 2024. The award carries a citation and a gold medal. The awardee is to deliver an oration at the National IAMM Conference to be held in 2025. Nominations must come as a soft copy to be sent to Secretary IAMM by the last
- 4. Dr KB Sharma Memorial Junior Best paper award 2024: Nominations are invited for the Best paper award competition to be held at National Conference of the IAMM at Pune in November 2024. This award is supported by the annual interest obtained from the fixed deposit, donated by the Dr. Urmil Sharma W/o Dr. K.B. Sharma. The contestant should be a member of IAMM, less than 35 years of age as on Aug 31, 2024 (certificate showing the proof of age should be attached) and be the principle author of the paper. The same paper should not have received any other award or be published in any other award or be published in any journal and should be so certified, as a signed declaration by the contestant. The above mentioned declarations as a soft copy of the full paper complete with tables, figures, etc. (prepared according to the format of the IJMM) should reach the IAMM Secretary's office on or before 31st July 2024. The award carries a citation and a gold

The selected candidate will receive the citation and a gold medal at the valedictory function of the IAMM Conference in November 2024. Nominations must come as a soft/hard copy to be sent to Secretary IAMM by the last date.

5. Prof AN Chakrabarthy memorial Prize for the best published paper in Mycobacteriology 2024:

Any member, who has published a paper in the field of Mycobacteriology during the preceding year i.e. 2023-24, in any National/International journal will be eligible to submit paper for the award. The paper should not have received any other award and a declaration to that effect should be submitted while applying for the award. The above mentioned declarations and soft copies of the full paper should reach the IAMM Secretary's office on or before 31st July 2024. The award carries a citation and a gold medal. The awardee will receive the award at the valedictory function of the IAMM Conference in November 2024.

6. Prizes for the best papers during the IAMM Conference **2024** (total seven categories listed below):

The following six prizes are given during the National Conference of the IAMM in Various categories:

- 1. NAWOPIA Dr. Pankajlaxmi V Venugopal Prize for the Best paper in Mycology.
- 2. Dr. SR Sengupta- Dr. AM Saoji memorial prize for the best paper in Immunology.
- 3. Dr. SS Kelkar Memorial prize for the best poster (any subject in Medical Microbiology).
- 4. IAMM silver Jubilee Prize for Best Paper in Parasitology.
- 5. Mumbai-Belgaum Prize for the best poster in Medical Mycobacteriology.
- 6. Belgaum-Mumbai Prize for the best paper in Bacteriology
- 7. I. D. Aggarwal-Broor Prize for the Best paper in Virology Nominations are invited for the above said prizes. Any IAMM member is eligible to contest for these awards. Abstracts for the award papers from interested members must be submitted along with membership number to the IAMM Secretary's office in a soft copy and also to the Organising Secretary. These will be subjected to peer review and only selected abstracts will be allowed to be presented as a paper at the respective oral/ poster sessions. The best paper amongst those will be adjudged the best paper by the panel of judges. The authors of an abstract must express their interest in a particular category while submitting the abstract. All the awards will be presented at the valedictory function of the IAMM Conference MICROCON 2024 to be held at Pune in November 2024. The Top Ten papers received for MICROCON 2024 will also be included for the Awards in the above mentioned subjects.
- 7. IAMM Mérieux Award 2024: Antimicrobial resistance (AMR) is a major public health issue worldwide. In order to provide an incentive for promising young investigators working in the field of AMR, Institut Mérieux has decided to institute a special Mérieux Award in partnership with IAMM in announcing, selecting and giving the Award at IAMM annual conference. The value of the award is approximately Euro 10,000, paid in equivalent Indian Rupees.

Selection criteria for the Mérieux Award: Investigators identified through IAMM and serving in a hospital or in a relevant research institution on a full time basis as infectious diseases clinician, clinical or molecular microbiologist or epidemiologist, with less than 10 years of either clinical practice experience or < 10 year of working experience in microbiology after their M.D / Ph.D. and who are involved and have made significant contribution in AMR research and/or patient management with a national impact.

The applications received for the said award will be assessed by the jury and 2 or 3 suitable applications will be forwarded to the scientific board of the Institut Merieux with their recommendations for the selection of the laureate. Institut Merieux will notify the association the name of the laureate, then the association will organize an award ceremony during its annual congress. In order to receive the award money, the institution (university, hospital, college etc.) hosting the laureate should engage an agreement with Institut Merieux. The intent letter from the head of the institution to receive the grant and its utilization must be submitted by the applicant. The award money will be transferred only to the host institution of the laureate, and the institution will hold responsibility for proper utilization of the fund for research by the laureate. All interested applications should reach the IAMM Secretary's Office in hard and soft copies both on or before 31st July

As per GB meeting the 46^{th} conference of IAMM was conducted as from 23rd-27th November 2022.

- a. Increase in number of editions of IJMM: This has been done by editorial team and all issues are online with no print issues.
- b. Purchase of lyophilizer by CMC, Vellore: This will be done this year.
- c. Purchase of land for permanent office of IAMM has been kept in abeyance.
- d. Dr Patil had informed that pathologists and rheumatology association have approached him regarding formulation of guidelines. Dr Sonal had discussed with them and found that the idea lacked merit and was hence dropped.
- e. Members felt that it would be better if IAMM brings out its own guidelines particularly for quality purposes for other topics. This was done by IAMM by publishing covid guidelines in 2023.
- f. Dr Reba Kanungo was entrusted the responsibility of exploring idea and inform Secretary. The members felt that IAMM should be in forefront to bring out the advisories or guidelines in the event of any infectious disease outbreak in the country.

Agenda 4. Secretary's Annual Report

The house ratified the annual secretary report read by Dr. Sonal Saxena during the inauguration function of the IAMM 2023 held on 23rd November 2023. The motion was proposed by Dr. Malini and seconded by Dr. Ujjala Ghoshal.

Agenda 5. Editor's report and statement of IJMM accounts Editor's report and statement of IJMM accounts was presented by Dr Chand Wattal. Salint points of the report are as follows:

- Increase of impact factor from 0.8 to 1.6
- Significant decrease in TAT for publication of articles

- by moving to continuous article publication method (immediate citation of article on acceptance)
- Waiving of author processing fees for better acceptability and affordability
- Increase in the number of issues in a year from 4 to 6,
- Initiation of three Special Issues in the coming months.
- Two new associate editors namely Dr. Kavitha Raja from Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute for Medical Sciences and Technology, Thiruvananthapuram- Kerala, and Dr Deepjyoti Kalita, from AIIMS Guwahati have been appointed.

The report and account statement was passed after being proposed by Dr Arunaloke and seconded by Dr Rakesh Singh..

Agenda 6. Presentation of Annual Statement of IAMM Accounts. Dr Manoj Kumar presented the account statement of 2022-23. Total revenue in FY 2022-23 was INR 24,56,554.00 (Revenue from Membership fee was INR 9,13,025.00 and revenue from interest was INR 15,43,529.00. As of now there are 3838 life members. In this year 183 Life Members, 44 annual members and 82 student Members were added.

Dr Arunaloke suggested to increase amounts in FD's rather than keeping money in savings account in view of higher interest rates. He also suggested to make our account tax free. The treasurer report was approved after being proposed by Dr Tanvir and seconded by Dr BL Sherwal.

Agenda 7. Report of IAMM EQAS Programme

Dr V. Balaji, and Dr. Rajesh Kannangai presented the EQAS reports of South India EQAS centers. ViroEQAS has 1009 laboratories while 1125 labs are associated with routine EQAS.

The reports of North Centre was read out by Dr Chand Wattal. There are 787 labortaories assocaired with North center. Renewal of PT provider accreditation was done by NABL in 2023.

EQAS New Delhi Team has started molecular EQAS Tier 2 w.e.f 2023. The report of both EQAS centers was accepted and approved. The motion was proposed by Dr V Ravi and seconded by Dr. Amita Joshi.

Agenda 8. Selection of topics for 47th IAMM Conference

GB discussed various topics for IAMM Symposium and Student Symposium and approved the following topics:

For the IAMM Symposium "Artificial Intelligence in Microbiology". Moderator: Dr V Balaji

For the Student Symposium: "Molecular Surveillance in Infectious Diseases. Moderator: Dr Ekta Gupta.

Agenda 9. Decision Regarding the venue for future IAMM Conference

47th IAMM Conference: GB approved the venue of the MICROCON-2024 as BJ Medical College, Pune, to be organized by department of Microbiology. Dr. Rajesh Karyakarte will be Organizing Chairperson. The website was launched and Dr. Rajesh formally invited the members to reach Pune in large numbers. The theme will be finalized and informed soon.

It was emphasized that the Organizing Committees of Microcon should not change the timings of conduction of IAMM activities. This should be followed strictly by the organizers.

48th MICROCON: The request has been received jointly from SGRH and MAMC, New Delhi to organize it in 2025. This was approved by GB.

It was decided to keep 2020 as e-MICROCON and continue with the present numbering system only.

It was also decided to name IAMM Conference as IAMM Congress. The motion was proposed by Dr Satish Patil and seconded by Dr Col Nagendra.

As the term of the office bearers have come to an end following office bearers were elected.

- President: Dr Bharti Malhotra
- Treasurer: Dr Sheela Devi
- Two Vacancies (EC) will be declared in Newsletter January 2024

GB approved the election of new office bearers, as recommended by Executive Committee

Agenda 12. Proposal/suggestions of training program, PG Assembly, IAMM PG Masterclass

Dr Sonal Saxena, Secretary suggested that IAMM should take further steps in providing quality education to Microbiologists. She suggested following two prepositions that were welcomed by members wholeheartedly.

 Certificate course/Training fellowship: Under governess of IAMM a core group can be made with no separate account for organizing training programs

IAMM training course can be organized in online mode with 1 or 2 contact sessions at a chosen center. The fellowship or training shall be paid by candidates and they will also make their own arrangement to travel and stay. The teaching material will be developed by a panel of experts as decided by EC. Following commtt members are proposed for finalization of details:

Dr Sonal Saxena (coordinator), Dr Sanjay Biswas, Dr Arunaloke Chakrabarti, Dr V Ravi, Dr C Wattal, and Dr B L Sherwal.

For Finalization of topic and development of material following names were approved:

Dr Sonal Saxena (Coordinator), Dr Yogesh Gupta, Dr Bharti Malhotra, Dr Abhay Chaudhary and Dr Syed Tanwir.

- Short training program for 3-5 days, paid by candidates and organized by centers willingly in their area of expertise.
 Following topics were suggested:
 - I) Molecular testing
 - ii) WHONET advance course
 - iii) Antibiogram making and interpretation
 - iv) Fungal diagnostics.

Support from industry and agencies such as WHO would be explored for the same by Secretary.

The announcement inviting proposals to conduct same shall be advertised in the newsletter. The proposals received will be vetted by the EC along with 1-2 senior members before finalization. 25% of the registration fee would be deposited in IAMM account. It is preferred that only inhouse faculty is utilized so the essence is for students to train at reputed institutes.

Agenda 13. Any other matter with permission from the chair.

- IJMM Reviwers: This issue was raised by Dr Chand Wattal. He mentioned lack of reviewers for IJMM causes delay in article processing. The following were suggested by EC that were approved by GB.
 - i) Core group of 4 senior faculty of IAMM be made who give 10 names of high quality reviewers for editors use. This is an attempt to increase the impact factor and create possibility of fast tracking articles.
- ii) EC members to assist in journal activities such as reviewers.
- Dr B L Sherwal raised the issue of NMC Ethics guidelines. If the Ethics guidelines were to be implemented that it would become difficult for organizers to raise funding for the conference. In this case an SOP would be made by EC with the help of past presidents to assist the organizers. It was proposed that some monetary support will have to given to the organizers from IAMM funds. This would require generating funds for the association and investing them wisely. Treasurer informed that organizers of 45th MICROCON have promised a sum of Rs. 5 lakhs to IAMM.
- It was proposed and accepted by GB that every year the organizers would give 10% of all average registration fees of all delegates (including free registrations if any) to IAMM. This would come in force from 2023 and continue irrespective of the ethics guidelines implementation. If any organizers have any leftover sum then that should also be given to IAMM after paying all taxes and GST. This would also help organizers to close their accounts after conference.
- The membership has not been revised for many years. It was discussed to have two types of membership instead of the present three types. Fees were revised accordingly from 2024.
- Associate Membership: Rs. 1000/- per year
- Life Membership: Rs. 10000/-

Associate membership would be for students or post doc fellows with Medical Microbiology

as core subject. It would be valid for one financial year till March 31st.

- It was suggested that the recordings of sessions of MICROCON can be uploaded online and charged to nonregistered viewers but will be free for registered participants of congress. This would be explored by EC with organizing comtt.
- SOP's for conducting the congress and PG Assembly with uniform draft program to be reviewed and revised. The members felt that the website needs overhauling and would require changes.
- Secretary informed that the current website manager is not doing changes in-spite of repeated reminders. The house entrusted the responsibility to EC to finalize website manager.
- The zoom connection would expire in January and this was also approved by the house for PG masterclass. Dr Sonal would continue to run PG Masterclass and you tube channel.

Notification for Elections of Executive Council (EC) Members of the IAMM

The Executive Council of the IAMM has two vacancies in the year 2024. As per the constitution of the IAMM, notice is hereby issued by the Secretary IAMM, inviting the nominations to these positions in EC of the IAMM. The following rules apply as per the Constitution of IAMM.

- 1. Members who have already served the Executive Council of the IAMM in the past are not eligible for re-election until after the lapse of two years.
- 2. Nominations for the memberships of Executive Council may be made by any two founder/Life members and shall be sent to Secretary's office. Such nominations must be accompanied by written undertaking from the nominee that he/she is willing to serve Executive Council.
